The Animal clinic has been attending to regular follow up cases and new cases of dogs with the viral illness - canine Parvovirus and Distemper. The cases are rising and in the morning mostly, the clinic is full of patients.



A dog with a cherry eye was brought from a neighbouring city, Siliguri. Dr. Deo has seen the dog and a small surgery was done. Vet Deo has suggested follow ups on his eye via phone. He will check upon the dog again when he and team go to Siliguri next week to conduct an Animal Birth Control camp.

Two mother dogs have been surrendered to KAS along with their puppies this week. One of the puppies has already got adopted and we are hoping others will find a Home too. These mother dogs will be spayed at KAS thereafter.
