

The monthly report from Kalimpong Animal Shelter

The Clinical cases have started to multiply at Kalimpong Animal Shelter due to the flow of patients coming for treatment. With the viral season outbreak, it is getting difficult for pet owners to take care of their dogs. The Vet and team are attending to over fifteen cases a day and sometimes, they are working overtime when the cases are brought late.

Cats are also getting infected with the feline disease this season as the cold has been quite harsh on them.



Before the year came to a close, three Village camps were conducted in December respectively at Dungra, Pedong, and 6th Mile, Kalimpong. Mrs. Yamima and Mr. Alain also made a camp visit there.

The total number of spaying done at Dungra was 11 including two cats and sixteen others were vaccinated against rabies.

Following this, a total of seven dogs and six cats were spayed at Pedong camp. The camp was held in the community hall there and the Govt. Vet Department was there to vaccinate the dogs against rabies.

The last camp was held in 6th Mile, Kalimpong which was organised by the community coordinator Mrs. Nandita. A total of thirteen dogs were spayed with twenty other vaccinations against rabies.

Dr. Deo has been performing ABCs on cats and dogs alternatively at the Shelter when there are fewer cases to see or else the ABC is done regularly leaving Saturdays. Emergency surgeries are also carried out when the need be.



A dog suffering from TVT (Transmissible Venereal Tumour) was brought to Kalimpong Animal Shelter by an animal lover from Siliguri. The dog was left unattended for many days until this gentleman saw him and thought to rescue him. Now the dog is admitted to KAS where her treatment is carried out. The dog will be handed over to the owner once she fully recovers.
