



New X-Ray Machine Installed at Darjeeling Animal Shelter

Darjeeling Animal Shelter has recently installed a new X-ray machine — a much-needed addition to the Shelter's clinic.

Previously, X-rays for rescued animals had to be carried out at private clinics located far from the Shelter, often making the process difficult for both our team and pet owners. With the installation of this machine, on-site diagnostics have become much more accessible. This will allow our veterinary team to carry out quicker and more efficient examinations, supporting timely treatment for both rescued animals and pet patients from the community.

RESCUE

This month, the DAS team rescued a total of 22 dogs from different locations, including two dogs from the neighbouring town of Mirik. Each rescued animal received prompt treatment at the Shelter. Some made a steady recovery and were released after completing their care. The commitment to timely medical attention continues to help many animals get back on their feet.

Clinical Cases

There was a surge in clinical cases at the Shelter with 647 treatments carried out this month. The cases ranged from general consultations to treatment for more serious conditions. Dr. Mohit reported a significant number of canine parvovirus cases along with TVT. Daily treatment services continued as usual, supported by emergency care and follow-up visits.



Animal Birth Control (ABC) Programme

DAS conducted its regular in-house ABC programme in March, sterilising 48 dogs and 11 cats. Dr. Shivani shared that of the 48 dogs sterilised, 40 were females and 8 males. All dogs underwent successful sterilisation.
